# Amended and Restated Southwest Conference (SWC or The Conference) United Church of Christ (UCC) Bylaws 

Approved April 29, 2023

## Definitions

Authorized Ministers (Ministers): All persons holding ministerial standing in the SWC.
Called Staff: Conference Staff who are authorized ministers and are exempt from the wage and hour provisions of the Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA).

Community: a network of people organized around the presence of Christ, which embraces a UCC identity and the values of the SWC, which exists within the geographical boundaries of the Conference and that has active standing held through the Committees on Church and Ministry.

Conference Delegates: Persons elected at the Annual Meeting of the Conference to serve on behalf of the Conference to General Synod or any other Special Called Meetings of the UCC.

Employed Staff: Conference Staff who are not authorized ministers and are not exempt from the wage and hour provisions of FLSA.

Inclusive: All references to inclusive or inclusivity shall incorporate the Open and Affirming Statement of the SWC.

Local Church: Churches as defined by the UCC Constitution and Bylaws that exist within the geographical boundaries of the Conference and that have active standing held through the Committee on Church and Ministry.

Meeting: either the Annual Meeting or a Special Meeting of the SWC.
Search Committee: A subcommittee of the Executive Board (EB) created for the sole purpose of recommending a candidate to the EB to fill a vacancy in the office of the Conference Minister.

Standing Committee: Permanent committees established by these bylaws (Nominating, Finance and Endowment, Personnel, and Committees on Church and Ministry). The EB has sole authority for creating or discontinuing Standing Committees.

Task Force: A group formed by the EB for the purpose of completing a task. They will function until the EB deems that their work is completed and then will be dissolved. The size, purpose, and composition of any Task Force will be left to the discretion of the EB.
A. The SWC recognizes that it exists to live out its covenantal relationship with the member

Local Churches and Communities that comprise the Conference, and shall do so by supporting those Local Churches in their missions and ministries, enabling them when possible to accomplish what they could not do alone; e.g., in planting new Local Churches, renewing existing Local Churches, assisting in creating Local Church legacies, and making available training for Ministers and laity.
B. The SWC of the UCC recognizes that covenant is the essence of its existence and therefore shall enjoy and celebrate its relationship with the General Synod of the UCC as that relationship is described in the Constitution of the UCC. The SWC shall also enjoy and celebrate its relationships with other organizations as authorized by the membership of this Conference.
C. In addition, the SWC shall provide services to its members in the Search and Call process, following the policies and guidelines of the UCC.
D. The SWC shall offer its guidance and direction to its members in areas that affect those Local Churches' continuing health and future faithfulness to their calling, including a Local Church's legacy.
E. The SWC shall also encourage, empower, exhort, and even at times admonish its members to enjoy and celebrate their covenantal relationship with each other, the SWC, the wider UCC, the ecumenical church, and interfaith communities.

Article III - Responsibilities of the SWC
A. Responsibilities

1. The SWC shall perform those functions identified as those of a Conference or Conference Acting as an Association in the Constitution and Bylaws of the UCC.
B. SWC Responsibilities
2. The Conference shall seek to undergird the mission and ministry of the Local Churches and Communities of which it is composed and of the General Synod, the Covenanted, Affiliated, and Associated Ministries of the UCC.
3. The Conference shall seek to nurture the spiritual life and witness of its members.
4. The Conference shall participate with Local Churches, Communities, and Ministers in the moral struggles of our time.
5. The Conference shall be an instrument of Christ's mission by helping to establish new communities of faith and assisting existing Local Churches in their effort to remain vital and healthy or assisting in legacy work.
6. The Conference shall provide a communication network among its Members and
7. The Conference shall make reasonable effort to preserve significant Conference historical records and for such significant records as any Local Churches or Communities may entrust to it, consistent with the Conference's ability to maintain such records.
8. The Conference shall act as an Association of the UCC in all ecclesiastical functions.
C. Rights and Responsibilities of the Local Churches and Communities
9. The Conference shall respect and recognize the rights of the Local Church as set forth in the constitution of the UCC which reads,
a. "The autonomy of the Local Church is inherent and modifiable only by its own action. Nothing in the constitution and the Bylaws of the United Church of Christ shall destroy or limit the right of each Local Church to continue to operate in the way customary to it; nor shall be construed as giving to the General Synod, or to any Conference or association now, or at any future time, the power to abridge or impair the autonomy of any Local Church in the management of its own affairs which affairs include, but are not limited to, the right to retain or adopt its own methods of organization, worship and education; to retain or secure its own charter and name; to adopt its own constitution and bylaws; to formulate its own covenants and confessions of faith; to admit members in its own way and to provide for their discipline or dismissal; to call or dismiss its pastor or pastors by such procedure as it shall determine; to own, manage and dispose of property and funds; to control its own benevolences; and to withdraw by its own decision from the United Church of Christ at any time without forfeiture of ownership or control of any real or personal property owned by it." [UCC Constitution Article V, paragraph 18]
b. "Within the United Church of Christ, the various expressions of the church relate to each other in a covenantal manner. Each expression of the Church has responsibilities and rights in relation to the others, to the end that the whole Church will seek God's will and be faithful to God's mission. Decisions are made in consultation and collaboration among the various parts of the structure. As members of the Body of Christ, each expression of the Church is called to honor and respect the work and ministry of each other part. Each expression of the Church listens, hears, and carefully considers the advice, counsel, and requests of others. In this covenant, the various expressions of the United Church of Christ seek to walk together in all God's ways. [UCC Constitution Article III]
c. Membership of a Local Church or Community in the SWC involves the following minimum rights and responsibilities:
i) Paying of the Conference per capita dues in a timely manner as defined in Conference policy;
ii) Financially supporting "Our Church's Wider Mission";
iii) Participating in the Annual Meeting and any Special Meetings of Delegates from Local Churches/Communities;
iv) Supplying information requested by the Conference, including annual report to data hub;
v) Recognizing that "actions by, or decisions or advice emanating from the General Synod, a Conference or Association, should be held in the highest regard by every Local Church." [Constitution of the United Church of Christ];
vi) Recognizing the Conference as a ministry with the Local Churches and Communities in our common life and service; and
vii) Using the Staff and facilities of the Conference in order to strengthen the life, work, and legacy of the Local Church/Community, or to negotiate internal conflict in the life of the Local Church/Community.
D. Membership
10. Members of the SWC are Local Churches within the geographic boundaries of the SWC as approved by the General Synod, Communities, and Authorized Ministers who hold standing in the Conference.
E. Delegates
11. Local Churches.
a. Local Churches shall be represented in the meetings of the Conference by voting Delegates. The number of voting Delegates representing each Local Church will relate, in general, to the number of members of that church. Local Churches of two hundred fifty members or fewer shall be entitled to five Delegates. Local Churches of more than two hundred fifty members shall be entitled to five Delegates for the first two hundred fifty members, plus one additional Delegate for every additional fifty members or fraction thereof. No Local Church shall have more than a total of ten Voting Delegates. The official number of members for a given Local Church will be that number reported by the Local Church to the Conference as of December 31 ${ }^{\text {st }}$ in the preceding year. Each Local Church shall select its own voting Delegates according to its own policy. All voting Delegates must be active members of a Local Church within the
geographical area of the Conference. Insofar as possible, prioritize inclusivity as a key value in selecting Delegates, and that Delegates be key leaders in the Local Church. Insofar as possible, Delegates shall represent their Local Church at all Conference meetings.
12. Ministers
a. Authorized Ministers who hold standing in the SWC shall be voting Delegates at meetings of the Conference, and they will not count in the total number of Delegates permitted to each Local Church.
b. Authorized Ministers while serving as a Minister in a Local Church of the SWC will be voting members if they currently hold Dual Standing in the Conference.
13. Communities
a. Member Communities shall be represented in the meetings of the Conference by voting Delegates. Each Community shall be entitled to five Delegates.
14. Official Leaders
a. Officers, EB members, and the Chairperson of the Nominating Committee of the SWC, shall be Delegates by virtue of office, and shall not be counted as Delegates from the Local Church or Community in which they hold membership.
15. Honorary Delegates
a. The Conference may extend to persons who are not members of the SWC an Honorary Delegate status by vote of the assembled voting Delegates, allowing voice but no vote.
16. General Synod Delegates
a. All Conference Delegates to the General Synod of the UCC shall be timely elected by the Conference from among its members at its Annual Meeting with the widest possible representation of the Local Churches and Communities and honoring inclusivity. Both lay and clergy are eligible to serve as General Synod Delegates. The Nominating Committee shall nominate Conference Delegates according to the Bylaws of the General Synod.
b. Conference Delegates to the General Synod shall have voice and vote at the Annual and Special Meetings of the SWC.

## F. SWC Meetings

1. Annual Meeting
a. The Conference shall meet annually in person or electronically at a time and place to be determined by the EB. Such meetings will normally occur at about twelve (12) month intervals. Official notice of the meeting shall be made not less than two months in advance. Notice may be given electronically.
b. The purposes of the Annual Meeting shall be to:
i) Provide an opportunity for fellowship among the Local Churches and Communities of the Conference.
ii) Elect Officers, EB members, Conference Delegates to General Synod and Standing Committee members. The Nominating Committee will present a slate of nominees to the Annual Meeting Delegates to any vacancies.
iii) Receive the reports of the Officers, Staff, committees, Local Churches and Communities and organizations related to the Conference.
iv) Approve the budget of the Conference.
v) Act on business forwarded to the Meeting by the UCC, Local Churches, Communities, and the EB of the Conference according to standing rules.
vi) Transact any other business brought before the Conference according to standing rules.
vii) Elect, when necessary, a Conference Minister as recommended by the EB from the Search Committee.

## 2. Special Meetings

a. Special Meetings of the Conference shall be convened only under the following rules:
i) By majority vote of a quorum of the EB, or upon written petition from at least twenty percent (20\%) of the member Churches directed to the Moderator of the Conference
ii) The Meeting will not be held sooner than forty-five (45) days and not later than sixty-five (65) days from the vote of the EB, or receipt of the petition.
iii) Notice of the Special Meeting shall be made no fewer than thirtyone (31) days in advance. Notice may be given electronically.
iv) The time and place of the Special Meeting shall be determined by the EB.
v) Actions taken at a Special Meeting shall be only on those matters for which the Meeting was specifically called.
3. Quorum
a. A quorum at any regular or Special Meetings of the Conference shall consist of those voting Delegates and officers of the SWC present, provided at least fifty percent (50\%) of the Local Churches and Communities are represented.
4. Voting
a. Regular business shall be decided by majority vote of the quorum of persons eligible to vote.
b. Special or corporate business shall require two-thirds (2/3) majority vote of the persons eligible to vote for passage. (Special or corporate business shall include amendments to these Bylaws, the call or dismissal of the Conference Minister, and approval of a special or new capital funds budget.)
c. There shall be no vote by proxy or absentee ballot. Online voting is permissible in online and hybrid meetings.
d. Following presentation of the Nominating Committee report to the Delegates at the Annual Meeting, there shall be an opportunity for nominations from the floor. A nominee from the floor must agree to serve in order for the nomination to be voted upon. If there are no nominations from the floor, the Annual Meeting will vote up or down the entire slate. If there are nominations from the floor that create a contested election, the Annual Meeting shall vote up or down the remainder or the entire slate except the contested elections, which shall be voted on separately.
e. The voting Delegates assembled in Special or Annual Meetings shall be the final authority for affairs of the Conference.
f. Called and Employed Staff of the office of the SWC shall have voice but no vote. They may speak to any action that is before Delegates at a Meeting of the Conference but may not initiate an action to come before that body.
g. All Ministers with standing, officers of the SWC, and voting Delegates of Local Churches and Communities shall have a vote in all meetings of the Conference.

## G. Committees

1. Permanent Standing Committees of the SWC shall be the Nominating Committee, the Personnel Committee, the Church and Ministry Committee Sections A and B, and the Finance and Endowment Committee.
a. The EB may designate additional committees as Standing Committees.
b. All Standing Committees shall be responsible for filling vacancies on their committee between Annual Meetings. Such interim appointments must be confirmed by the EB. Appointments by the committee are valid only until the next Annual Meeting when such vacancy shall be filled by election.
c. Insofar as possible, Standing Committees' composition shall prioritize inclusivity as a key value.
d. The Nominating Committee shall serve between Annual Meetings to nominate individuals to fill vacancies in offices. Such appointments are subject to confirmation by the EB.
e. Committee members shall be elected at the Annual Meeting of the SWC.
f. Each committee shall review its purpose annually with the EB of the SWC.
2. Nominating Committee
a. The Nominating Committee shall consist of six (6) members elected by the Delegates at the Annual Meeting. The composition of the Nominating Committee shall prioritize inclusivity as a key value of the Conference and endeavor to include one member from each of the five geographical regions of the Conference.
b. The Nominating Committee shall select its own chairperson.
c. Terms of office for members of the Nominating Committee shall be two (2) years.
d. A person may serve two consecutive terms and then shall not be eligible for re-election for a period of one (1) year.
e. Anyone asked to fill an unexpired term, and who serves less than 1 year in that position, is eligible to serve a full term following that partial term, if nominated and elected at the Annual Meeting, and to serve one
successive full term, if nominated and elected at the Annual Meeting.
f. Terms shall be staggered to allow one half of the Nominating Committee's terms to expire every two years.
g. The Nominating Committee shall prioritize inclusivity as a key value in making nominations while ensuring that the skills and talents called for are present if at all possible.
3. Personnel Committee
a. The Conference shall elect to the Personnel Committee four (4) members and shall prioritize inclusivity as a key value of the Conference. These persons shall be elected at-large from the Conference with staggered terms. The Moderator-Elect shall serve ex-officio on the Personnel Committee with vote.
b. The Committee shall select its own chairperson.
c. Terms of office for elected members of the Personnel Committee shall be three (3) years.
d. A person may serve two consecutive terms and then shall not be eligible for re-election for a period of one (1) year.
e. Anyone asked to fill an unexpired term, and who serves less than 1.5 years in that position, is eligible to serve a full term following that partial term, if nominated and elected at the Annual Meeting, and to serve one successive full term, if nominated and elected at the Annual Meeting.
f. The Personnel Committee shall be responsible for the administration of the Personnel Policy and Procedures of the SWC.
g. The Personnel Committee is accountable to the EB. The Personnel Committee will provide all reports of deliberations to the EB, except for confidential matters as determined by the Personnel Committee.
h. The Personnel Committee responds to requests for personnel information/actions only with the consent of the Moderator and the advice of legal counsel.
4. Committee on Church and Ministry, Section A- Ministerial Authorization (COCAM-A)
a. The Conference shall elect twelve (12) members to COCAM-A and shall prioritize inclusivity as a key value of the Conference. There shall be, insofar as possible, at least four (4) lay members on the Committee. There shall be at least two (2) members from the Central Arizona Region,
and at least one from each of the other Regions (the remainder of Arizona, Northern New Mexico, and Southern New Mexico / El Paso TX).
b. COCAM-A shall handle matters of ministerial authorization according to the policies, practices, and recommendations of the UCC as well as its own rules, so long as they are consistent with those of the UCC.
c. The Committee shall elect its own chairperson.
d. Terms of office shall be three (3) years. Terms shall be staggered such that members are elected in three (3) classes, each with four (4) members.
e. A person may serve two consecutive terms and then shall not be eligible for re-election for a period of one (1) year.
f. Anyone asked to fill an unexpired term, and who serves less than 1.5 years in that position, is eligible to serve a full term following that partial term, if nominated and elected at the Annual Meeting, and to serve one successive full term, if nominated and elected at the Annual Meeting.
g. Oversight actions that result in the change of ministerial authorization by the COCAM-A are subject to appeal. The appeal will be made to and heard by the EB. The only grounds upon which an appeal can be made will be regarding whether COCAM-A materially departed from the process adopted by the SWC so as to guarantee consistency of policy implementation, control access to confidential and sensitive material, promote information sharing, and minimize politicization of an ecclesiastical authorization matter.
h. Only the Minister under review whose authorization status changed as a result of the Committees deliberations may file the appeal. An appeal must be filed within 30 days of COCAM-A's decision. The EB must undergo a full orientation to the process prior to hearing the appeal. Only those members of the EB who are present for the orientation and for the entirety of the hearing for the appeal may vote on the outcome of the appeal. Possible outcomes of the vote include affirmation that the process used was sufficiently consistent with the one adopted by the SWC; acknowledgement that the process used was in a sufficient way not the one adopted for use by the SWC. If the latter, the EB will direct COCAM-A to reconsider the action, without materially departing from the adopted process, policies, and procedures of the SWC.
5. The Committee on Church and Ministry, Section B - Church Standing and Relationships (COCAM-B)
a. The Conference shall elect nine (9) members to COCAM-B and shall
prioritize inclusivity as a key value of the Conference. There shall be at least three (3) lay members on the Committee. There shall be, insofar as possible, at least two (2) members from Central Arizona Region, and at least one from each of the other four geographic regions of the Conference (Northern Arizona, Southern Arizona, North Central New Mexico, Southern New Mexico/El Paso).
b. COCAM-B shall handle matters of church standing and covenant relations according to the policies, practices, and recommendations of the UCC as well as its own rules, so long as they are consistent with those of the UCC.
c. The Committee shall elect its own chairperson.
d. Terms of office shall be three (3) years. Terms shall be staggered such that members are elected in three (3) classes, each with two (2) members.
e. A person may serve two consecutive terms and then shall not be eligible for re-election for a period of one (1) year.
f. Anyone asked to fill an unexpired term, and who serves less than 1.5 years in that position, is eligible to serve a full term following that partial term, if nominated and elected at the Annual Meeting, and to serve one successive full term, if nominated and elected at the Annual Meeting.
g. COCAM-B is empowered to conduct ministerial oversight proceedings when COCAM-A is unable to do so.
6. Finance and Endowment Committee (FEC)
a. The Conference shall elect four (4) members to the FEC. These persons shall be elected at-large from the Conference and shall prioritize inclusivity as a key value of the Conference. The Treasurer shall serve on the FEC as an ex-officio Member with vote.
b. The Committee shall elect its own chairperson.
c. Terms of office shall be three (3) years except that initially one will be elected for one (1) year and one for two (2) years, and two will be elected for three (3) years.
d. A person may serve two consecutive terms and then shall not be eligible for re-election for a period of one (1) year.
e. Anyone asked to fill an unexpired term, and who serves less than 1.5 years in that position, is eligible to serve a full term following that partial term, if nominated and elected at the Annual Meeting, and to serve one
successive full term, if nominated and elected at the Annual Meeting.
f. The purpose of the FEC is:
i) to manage the Conference endowment funds, both undesignated and designated funds, to ensure the greatest return while ensuring the funds are invested consistent with the values of the Conference.
ii) to manage the Conference finances generally in coordination with the Treasurer and EB.
g. FEC is accountable to the EB and all reports of its deliberations shall be provided to the EB.

## Article IV - Executive Board

A. Membership and Election

1. The EB shall be comprised of nine (9) members. Both lay and clergy are eligible to serve. All members of the EB shall be active members in a Local Church or Community in the SWC. The EB composition shall have the widest possible representation of the Local Churches and Communities and shall prioritize inclusivity as a key value. The nine members shall include the four officers of the Conference, and five at-large members.
2. Terms of office for at-large members of the EB shall be three (3) years. Terms shall be staggered such that at-large members are elected in two (2) classes, of two (2) and three (3) members respectively.
3. At-large members may serve two consecutive terms and then shall not be eligible for re-election for a period of one (1) year.
4. Any vacant unexpired term will be filled by consent of the Nominating Committee. Anyone asked to fill an unexpired term, and who serves less than 1.5 years in that position, is eligible to serve two full terms following that if nominated and if elected at the Annual Meeting.
5. For purposes of Arizona law concerning the governance of 501(c) 3 corporations, the EB is the Board of Directors of the SWC.
B. Responsibilities of the EB
6. The EB shall handle the policy-making responsibilities of the SWC between Annual Meetings of the Conference. This shall include coordinating current programs and projects, establishing new churches, developing priorities consistent with the mission of the SWC, and long-range plans and strategies. The

EB shall make decisions with respect to Staff, and act on financial matters as may be necessary or required.
2. Between Annual Meetings of the Conference, the EB may convene at least one Town Hall Meeting with one or more Delegates from Local Churches and Communities, and any Authorized Ministers. The purpose of the meeting shall be informational and not decision making. The EB will give status reports to the Delegates and the Delegates shall have the opportunity to express policy goals and directions to the EB.
3. The EB shall control and manage all property of the Conference, and whenever they shall deem it for the best interest of the Conference may assign, buy, mortgage, lease, sell, or convey any real or personal property. The deeds, conveyances, notes, mortgages, pledge agreements, trust deeds, and any instruments required in such authorized transactions shall be signed by any two (2) EB Officers. The EB shall designate the Officers or persons who shall have the power to sign receipts, endorse checks, deposit funds, and draw checks or other orders for withdrawal of funds belonging to the Corporation.
4. Whenever the EB shall authorize the execution of delivery of a conveyance of real property to a Local Church or Community within the SWC, it shall be the policy to include in such conveyance a "Reversionary Clause" providing in substance for the reversion of the title to the Conference in the event the grantee shall cease to be or function as a UCC Local Church or Community, or shall fail or neglect to conform to any other condition that may be prescribed by the grantor in said conveyance. There will be a recommendation that such "Reversionary Clause" be included in the title, deed, or conveyancing instrument and in the bylaws of the Local Church or Community.
5. The EB shall make an Annual Report to the Conference.
6. The EB shall have the power to interpret these Bylaws.
7. The EB shall have the authority to create Task Forces in order to facilitate the work and mission of the Conference.
8. Meetings of the EB are open to members of the Conference; however, closed Executive Sessions may be called to discuss sensitive personnel matters and certain legal issues.
9. Upon notice of a vacancy in the office of the Conference Minister, the EB will recommend and appoint a Conference Minister Transition Team and/or Search Committee. A Transition Team shall be composed of five (5) members. A Search Committee shall be composed of nine (9) to eleven (11) members. In addition, the Moderator or Moderator-Elect may serve ex-officio with voice but no vote. Search Committee members will represent a cross-section of the membership of the Local Churches and Communities and shall prioritize inclusivity as a key
value. The EB will appoint a chairperson from among the members of the Search Committee.
10. Meetings of the EB will function according to Robert's Rules of Order.
C. Officers

1. Officers of the Conference shall be the Moderator, who is also the Chairperson of the EB; The Moderator-Elect; the Secretary; and the Treasurer. All officers serve with voice and vote on the EB.
2. Election and Terms. Officers shall be elected by the Conference at the Annual Meeting. Terms of office shall be two (2) years. The Moderator Elect shall serve one (1) year as Moderator-Elect and succeed to the office of Moderator for one (1) year without subsequent election. However, the EB may request the outgoing Moderator to remain as a member of the EB with voice but no vote for an additional year. The Secretary and Treasurer may serve two consecutive terms and then shall not be eligible for re-election for a period of one (1) year.
3. Moderator. The Moderator shall preside at all meetings of the Conference and the EB; make a report to the Annual Meeting of the Conference; and do such other duties as requested by the EB. The Moderator shall consult with the Conference Minister.
4. Moderator-Elect. The Moderator-Elect shall assume the duties of the Moderator in his/her/their absence, or when requested by the Moderator to do so, and other duties as prescribed by the EB. The Moderator-Elect is also a member of the Personnel Committee.
5. Secretary. The Secretary shall record the minutes of all meetings, issue the call to the Meetings of the Conference, and conduct such correspondence as requested by the EB.
6. Treasurer. The Treasurer shall maintain the financial records of the SWC and shall be responsible for income, expenditures, investments, and other financial business. The Treasurer shall report annually to the Conference. An audit or review shall be conducted periodically. The Treasurer shall report to the EB and the Annual Meeting of the Conference. In the event of the absence of both the Moderator and the Moderator-Elect, the Treasurer shall preside at the meetings of the EB. The Treasurer is also a member of the FEC.

Article V - SWC Task Forces
A. Purpose.

1. SWC Task Forces will be formed to facilitate the mission of the Conference, to build a network of allies from within and outside the Conference to support that
mission, to identify any resources that would help our covenant partners fulfill that mission, and to find effective ways to communicate relevant information to those engaged in that mission.
B. Composition
2. SWC Task Forces will remain open to people who feel called to, qualified for, and passionate about the undertaking of the specific purpose for which the task Force is formed.
C. Meetings
3. Each Task Force will bear responsibility for organizing itself, and for scheduling meeting times and locations that enable its participants to be fully engaged in the work of the Task Force.
4. All meetings of the SWC Task Forces will operate with consensus.
5. Each year that a Task Force continues to operate, it will appoint a Chair and a Recording Secretary. It will inform the Conference Office who it has appointed to fill these roles. The Chair will work with Conference Staff to arrange and organize its meetings. The Recording Secretary will document the content of the meeting discussions, and record any actions agreed to by the Task Force. Copies of the minutes of Task Force meetings are to be filed with the Conference Office.
D. Budget
6. The Budget of the SWC may include line items for each Task Force called for by the EB. Those budgeted funds are to be used to cover the meeting expenses of the Task Force. If any Task Force anticipates budgetary expenses in addition to meeting costs, that request must be submitted to the EB no later than sixty days prior to the fiscal year for which the funds are being requested.

## Article VI - Conference Minister and Staff/Personnel

A. Conference Minister

1. The Conference Minister shall be an ordained minister in full standing with the UCC or an Ordained Ministerial Standing Partner and shall be the Chief Executive Officer of the Conference in accordance with the policies established by the EB and Call Agreement.
2. The Conference Minister shall be informed in regard to every phase of the work undertaken by the Conference.
3. The Conference Minister shall organize, direct, and coordinate all the work of the Conference consistent with the values of the SWC.
4. The Conference Minister shall represent the Conference before the Local Churches and Communities and in all ecumenical and interfaith gatherings unless the EB specifically directs otherwise.
5. The Conference Minister shall ensure all clergy with standing in the SWC receive pastoral care from a pastor of their choosing and shall provide pastoral care as requested for clergy serving in ministry settings.
6. The Conference Minister shall assist Local Churches in pastoral search and call.
7. The Conference Minister, when called upon, shall provide pastoral care to Local Churches and Communities in the absence of a local pastor.
8. The Conference Minister shall be an advisory and ex-officio member of all Boards, Committees, and Task Forces of the Conference with voice but no vote, except for Delegate assemblies of the Conference where the privilege of both voice and vote are granted.
9. The Conference Minister shall make a report to each meeting of the EB and be accountable to the EB.
10. Election
a. The Conference Minister shall be elected and called by the Conference upon nomination by the EB and shall serve for an indefinite period.
b. The Conference Minister's call agreement can be ended with two (2) months' notice only by either the Conference Minister resigning according to the Call Agreement, or by a $2 / 3$ majority vote of the Delegates at an Annual or Special Meeting of the Conference. The dismissal may be in less than two (2) months if mutually agreed to by the EB and the Conference Minister. The Conference Minister may be terminated immediately for cause by the EB. Such a decision will be made transparent with due process by the EB.
c. In case of a vacancy in the office of the Conference Minister, the EB shall have power to appoint an Interim, Acting, Transitional or Designated Conference Minster.

## B. Called Ministerial Associates and Other Employed Staff

1. The Staff shall be employed or dismissed as follows:
a. Ministerial Associates of the Conference Minister shall be called and elected by the EB upon nomination by a subcommittee in consultation with the Conference Minister. Such Associates serving under specific job descriptions will be supervised by the Conference Minister and
accountable to the Conference Minister and the EB.
b. Ministerial Associates shall serve for an indefinite period of time which shall end with two months' notice only by either the Ministerial Associate submitting a letter of resignation to the EB according to their Call Agreement, or by the recommendation and approval of the Conference Minister and the EB.
c. Employed Staff and other office support staff shall be selected, employed, and dismissed by the Conference Minister, in accordance with the Personnel Policies and Procedures of the SWC.
d. Rates of compensation and other benefits pertaining to Ministerial Associates shall be decided by the EB and set forth in their Call Agreement(s). Rates of compensation and other benefits pertaining to Ministerial Associates shall be decided by the Conference Minister, in accordance with the Personnel Policies and Procedures of the SWC.

Article VII Rules of Order
A. The rules contained in the current edition of Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised shall govern the SWC of the UCC in all cases to which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with these Bylaws and any special rules of order the SWC of the UCC may adopt.
B. The SWC permits the use of available technology to conduct Annual and Special Meetings, all meetings of boards and committees. Any decisions reached while using technology designed to enhance communication and reduce cost shall be deemed binding and effective. Such decisions shall be reflected in the minutes of that board or committee.
C. Unanimous consent via email or other form of documented communication is permitted in lieu of a noticed meeting.

## Article VIII - Dissolution Clause

A. Upon dissolution of the Conference, no part of its property, not any of its proceeds thereof, nor any of its net assets shall be distributed to or accrue to the benefit of any members of the Conference that are not registered 501(c)3 corporations.
B. Upon said dissolution, after paying or adequately providing for the Conference's debts and obligations, the Directors or persons in charge of liquidation shall distribute all of the Conference's said remaining property, proceeds and net earnings, as directed by the members of the Conference, to an organization, fund, foundation, or church organized and operated exclusively for religious or charitable purposes that is a subsidiary of or affiliated with the UCC or any successor thereto.
